## LAF News By Judith Mann



### Juareguito, Thein, Wartluft vs. Feather Community College

Michelle Juareguito, former director of the Upward Bound/Talent Search program at Feather, Paul Thein, former vice president of student services, athletic director, and dean of students; and Laurel Wartluft, former head coach and faculty member, sued Feather River Community College for sex discrimination and retaliation in violation of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972.

In spring 2008, the lawyers in these cases submitted closing and reply briefs from the November 2007 trial to the California State Personnel Board. The judge submitted a decision to the CA State Personnel Board in August, 2009, ruling in favor of all three plaintiffs and awarding reinstatement, back pay and damages. The PERSONNEL BOARD rejected the decision, however, and the judge will have to present an oral argument to the Board at a later date. Juareguito's trial is still set for Aug 21, 2010; Thein's for July 20, 2010, Wartluft's for May 18, 2010. To date, LAF has contributed from \$37,000 to \$40,000 to each plaintiff.

### Mansourian et al., v. Regents of the University of California, et al

Arezou Mansourian and her fellow plaintiffs were students of the Univ of California, Davis and were members of the university's wrestling team. They sued the regents of the UC for sex discrimination in violation of Title IX.

The plaintiffs have appealed the judge's ruling against them, which dealt with whether there was sufficient notice of the discrimination, not whether the discrimination occurred. The appeal also questions whether a Title IX claim supplants an equal protection claim. In Feb 2009, the National Women's Law Center, the ACLU, and other women's rights groups submitted appellate briefs supporting the plaintiffs' briefs. AAUW signed on to the brief submitted by the NWLC. In Oct. 2009, the US Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit heard oral arguments and is expected to issue a written decision within six months. To date, LAF has awarded \$59,000+ in support of the wrestlers' case. "Based on the questions and comments by the judges, I feel very optimistic that we will get a strong decision out of it" said Kristen Galles, an attorney for the case, she went on to say, **"Thanks again to AAUW for signing on to the amicus brief written by the National Women's Law Center."**

### Schuster v. Berea College

Claire Schuster, a tenured Associate Professor of Nursing, sued Berea College for sex discrimination in compensation in violation of the Kentucky Civil Rights Act.

The court ruled in favor of Berea College, but the Kentucky Court of Appeals reversed the judgment. The Appeals Court found that the trial court had repeatedly denied Schuster use of critical discovery. Berea College challenged the decision in a motion for reconsideration.

In Dec. 2008, the KY Ct. of Appeals once again ruled in favor of Schuster. The college filed a motion on Dec. 5, 2008 for discretionary review with the KY Supreme Court. Schuster filed a response to Berea's motion for discretionary review on Jan 15, 2009.

The KY Supreme Ct. ruled on Aug. 18, 2009 in favor of Schuster, denying Berea College's motion for discretionary review of the appeals court decision and remanding the case for a new trial. In Nov. 2009, the Madison County Ct of Appeals denied Schuster the right of a new trial and sought clarification from the appeals Court. To date, LAF has awarded Schuster over \$57,000 in support.

# Why Pay Equity Matters

(Part 1 of 2) BY PATRICIA DILKS

Equal Pay Day (which is April 20<sup>th</sup>) is not just about disseminating information, it is also about mobilizing around the issue to educate our community and continue the process of change. AAUW believes that pay equity is a simple matter of justice and continues to support initiatives that seek to close the persistent and sizable wage gaps between men and women. AAUW's organization-wide programmatic theme "Education as the Gateway to Women's Economic Security" was adopted in June 2005 and reflects AAUW's recognition of women's educational gains as well as the understanding that women's progress has not yet translated into economic security.

## Facts and Figures about Pay Equity

**Equal pay is a priority issue for all women.** Among issues identified as priorities for women, 90 percent say that equal pay for equal work is a priority.<sup>7</sup> Pay disparities affect women of all ages, races, and education levels – regardless of their family decisions. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, women, on average, earned 22 percent less than men did in 2007.

**Women of color are impacted even more.** Women of color saw an even greater difference as African American women earned 30 percent less and Latinas earned 42 percent less than did men as a whole.

**Women are still largely pigeonholed in "pink-collar" jobs.** According to the AAUW Educational Foundation's 2003 report, *Women at Work*, women are still concentrated in traditionally female-dominated professions, especially the education and health industries. Today the highest proportion of women with a college education includes elementary school teachers (8.7 percent) and registered nurses (6.9 percent).

**Education and career training is crucial for women.** *Behind the Pay Gap*, AAUW Educational Foundation's 2007 report, found that women and men who majored in —male-dominated□ subjects earn more than those who major in —female-dominated□ or —mixed-gender□ fields. One year after graduation, the average female education major working full time only earns 60 percent as much as the average female engineering major working full time earns.

**The wage gap has long term effects on women's economic security.** Women are more likely than men to enter poverty in old age for several reasons: (1) a lifetime of lower wages means women have less income we can save for retirement, and less income that counts in a Social Security or pension benefit formula; (2) women's current life expectancy is approaching 86 years old, which means we outlive men by an average of 3 years, so we will have to stretch our retirement savings – which are less to begin with – over a longer period of time; and (3) the median income of older women is almost half what it is for older men.
